





TCLCT French Translator Fellowship

The <u>Trinity Centre for Literary and Cultural Translation</u>, <u>Trinity College Dublin</u>, the <u>French Embassy in Ireland</u> and <u>Alliance Française Dublin</u> seek applications from <u>French literary translators</u> for a residential translator fellowship in Dublin. Our highly prestigious fellowships are awarded to practising literary translators who are working on the translation a work of literature by an Irish author into French.

Fellowships last two months and include travel and living expenses and accommodation, as well as workspace inside the Trinity Centre for Literary and Cultural Translation. Our Fellows have access to the library of Trinity College Dublin, as well as a wide range of other facilities within the University, contact with the members of the academic staff, free attendance at a range of academic events across the university, and especially at the Trinity Centre for Literary and Cultural Translation.

During their stay, our Translation Fellows are asked to devote themselves to their work as literary translators, become active members of the Trinity Centre for Literary and Cultural Translation, and use the Centre as their main work base. They interact with the wider College community, take part in public events organised by the Trinity Centre for Literary and Cultural Translation, the Alliance Française and the French Embassy, and join classes with master's students in literary translation.

At end of their stay, Translation Fellows are asked to showcase their translation work in a public event and may return to Dublin on the publication of their book for a launch hosted by the Trinity Centre for Literary and Cultural Translation.

Translation Fellows are responsible for obtaining any necessary documents/visas to come to Ireland, and obtaining international health insurance.

The Fellowship this year runs from the beginning of October until the end of November 2021.

Applications are made using this online form. The deadline for applications this year is 15th July 2021.
